

Seeds of Literacy Celebrates 25 Years

In 1997, the Congregation of St. Joseph provided start-up funds to help establish Seeds of Literacy, an adult literacy and educational services organization, as a way to honor their 125 years of service to the Diocese of Cleveland. Dedicated educators, the sisters recognized adult basic education as a crucial component in helping to eradicate poverty, hunger, and homelessness, and empower people to achieve meaningful, fulfilled lives. Seeds of Literacy was unique from the start, offering one-to-one, individualized instruction and reaching Cleveland communities with the greatest need. Today, Seeds serves an average of 1,000 active students annually with the help of approximately 250 volunteer tutors, and offers year-round classes. To celebrate their 25th Anniversary, a Silver Jubilee event was held on May 19th at the Cleveland Metroparks Zoo. Sister
